

Vision

- Strong experienced leadership with the vision to plan, articulate necessary change and follow-through with that change to shepherd inspiration, hope, economic growth, and sustainability
- Improve and increase public and private sector opportunity to assist more New Mexicans out of poverty and ill health
- Communicate, illustrate, and unveil a statewide and regional economic plans so people know
 what employment they can choose close to or at home and across the state to invigorate our
 economy, rebuild infrastructure, and create more vitality and investment in community life for all
 sectors, particularly millennials of our state

The Need

- We must change the way we do business develop smarter business models
- Create a three-year development cycle that includes: improving our education and health care models, more tax reform, successfully implement these changes, and provide statewide education of the changes that will advance our state
- We need government <u>stability</u>, business friendly <u>continuity</u>, and gradual <u>growth</u> throughout the state, not just in urban pockets
- We already see great regional development -- like in the Las Cruces area where the population and trade with Mexico are expanding we must take this template and apply it in other regions where Native American and Hispanic populated areas can enjoy growth in their own unique ways

The Budget

- Health Care and Education are foremost for population well-being, happiness, and thirst for accomplishment
- The judiciary, law enforcement, and corrections are essential to protect our communities from more vandalism, robbery, senseless killing, preventable accidents, illegal drug activity, and arson
- Early childhood services like home visits filled with counseling and nutrition guidance are essential components for success in life
- A tighter control and efficiency of government services and accountability will help to restore confidence by the general public in the services their tax dollars provide
- Wise investment by government and the private sector in development, infrastructure, facilities, programs, and operations lead to real strength in providing good paying jobs, paying salaries beyond the minimum wage, creating long-term careers, and looking ahead at potential expansion in the job and business innovation markets

Real Tax Reform

- Close or shrink tax loopholes focus on fairness and more money left in the pockets of middleclass wage earners
- Keep locals in mind -- make our tax system fair and simple so local small business merchants can compete with large marketers, basic services like electrical and plumbing, and quality hardware products for everyday home maintenance and servicing
- Develop progressive not regressive tax reform

Educate the public of the pathway taken

- Share the vision make the message interactive so the people's input is included in the change they want for their state
- Plan long-term, systemically and with positive and measurable outcomes in mind
- Maintain flexibility so what doesn't work can be eliminated and what does work expanded
- Promote the positive, share the optimism, and ensure that the public doesn't take a step backward when they go to work, make a living, and move from government health and food assistance to full-time employment and self-sufficiency, sustainability, and eventual retirement
